- Ensure recognition for satisfactorily completed activities of study mobility and, where possible, traineeships of its mobile students.

- Accept all activities indicated in the learning agreement as counting towards the degree, provided these have been satisfactorily completed by the mobile student.
- Provide, free-of-charge, incoming mobile students and their sending institutions with transcripts in English or in the language of the sending institution containing a full, accurate and timely record of their achievements at the end of their mobility period.
- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the Institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- 4. Termination of the agreement

[It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."]

. Grading systems of the institutions

Grading system used at the Instituto Politécnico do Porto, Portugal:

1 - Local Grades

In the national grading system, the results are awarded in a scale from 0 to 20, and the minimum mark required for approval is 10.

2 - ECTS Grades

The ECTS grading scale is based on the percentile of a student in a given assessment, expressing the student's performance relatively to other students enrolled in the last three years of the same curricular unit/course (or in a significant group of students). Hence there is no direct fixed correspondence between the ECTS grade and the local grade.

Portugal adopted ECTS mechanisms for our higher education system by law.

At IPP, the transfer of grades follows the ECTS procedures established in the Portuguese legislation which reflects these principles (DL 42/2005). Hence the ECTS grade calculation is made considering the percentile of each student that reflects the relative position of his/her mark in each curricular unit/course.

Grading system used at the Federal Institute of Santa Catarina, Brazil:

1 - Grades and Frequency Resolution

According to the Resolution of the Institutional Superior Council No. 20, of June 25, 2018, is approved the Didactic-Pedagogical Regulation of IFSC (accessed through this link) which stipulates, among other measures, the following:

- Attendance to activities corresponding to each curricular component will be mandatory, with students failing when not met the required 75% (seventy-five percent) attendance rate.
 - The evaluation result will be registered by the professor, in the academic system, in integer values from 0 (zero) to 10 (ten), being:
 - The minimum result for passing a curricular component is 6 (six).





- The student who attends less than 75% (seventy-five percent) of the workload established in the PPC for the curricular component will be assigned a value of 0 (zero).
- The partial registration of each curricular component will be carried out by the teacher in the class diary in the form of integer values from 0 (zero) to 10 (ten).
- The teacher's decision on the final result will depend on the analysis of the set of assessments, their weightings and the discussions of the final class council.
- The assessment will be carried out, in each curricular component, considering the objectives or competences proposed in the teaching plan.

Finally, the above-mentioned measures taken are the preponderant guiding ones when evaluating a student and his/her ability to accomplish or not a curricular unit.
